

SPRINGVILLE CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

March 19, 2012

Mayor Heeren called the regular meeting of the Springville City Council to order at 6:00 pm at Springville City Hall. Present on roll call: Miller, Grimley, Brady, Shebetka and Ralston. Also present: Brandon French, Todd Wyman, Jeff Kramer and Doug Beard.

Consent Agenda: Motion was made by Shebetka, second by Grimley to approve the consent agenda with the removal of the finance report. All ayes, motion carried.

Citizens With Concerns Not on the Agenda: Councilperson Ralston inquired on the status of the fire siren. Concern has been expressed about the lack of a siren with the volatile spring weather that is going on in the rest of the country. Todd reported the repair parts are in and waiting for the electrician to come and install them. Mareta asked if the noon whistle would then sound every day. Todd noted that the timer could be set however it needed to be set, but that the more the whistle was sounded the more wear and tear on the parts of an older siren so that would be up to the Council how they wanted that done.

Reports: Todd informed the council they have borrowed a bucket broom for the Bobcat and are working at getting streets swept.

Old Business:

Nuisance Abatement: City Hall is getting many complaints about dogs running at large and also dog owners not cleaning up after their dogs when they are walking them. Dogs running at large will be picked up by Cedar Valley Humane Society. Warning notices will be put on the blue channel, in the newsletter and on posters.

115 Circle Drive Sewer Back-up: The claim has been turned over to the City's insurance company. The claims adjuster had spoken with Todd and will contact the homeowners to meet with them.

New Business:

Broadway Street Restoration: Jeff Kramer of NRG Sales was present to discuss lighting for the business block street restoration. Jeff brought samples of a couple of the lights and also copies of several other types of pole lights. Discussion was held on LED lights, illumination, glare, height of the poles, how far apart the poles should be, how many fixtures are needed, lights in other cities, installation of flag, banner and Christmas light extensions, product materials information, time frames and cost. Motion was made by Shebetka, second by Miller to purchase 8 black Lumec (6) light fixtures that are 15' high with a bottleneck pole that has extensions for flags, banners and Christmas decorations with an electrical outlet on the pole. All ayes, motion carried.
