

SPRINGVILLE CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

October 01, 2012

Mayor Heeren called the regular meeting of the Springville City Council to order at 7:00 pm at Springville City Hall. Present on roll call: Miller, Grimley, Shebetka, Ralston and Brady. Also present: Chris and Sara Williams, Doug Beard, Pat Hoyt, Mike Hudson, Todd Wyman and Deputy Louis.

Consent Agenda: Motion was made by Shebetka, second by Ralston to approve the consent agenda as posted. All ayes, motion carried.

Citizens With Concerns Not on the Agenda: Chris and Sara Williams were present to respond to their dog being on the list of problem dogs Lena Gilbert submitted to the Council at the September 17th council meeting. Williams noted their dog does bark at people passing by however, the dog is behind a chain link fence, has never gotten out of their yard and has never bitten anyone including the daycare children. Williams stated they will be installing a privacy fence on the sidewalk side of the property to forestall any further complaints. Williams also addressed the "NO PARKING" on the east side of 4th Street issue with the council.

Reports

Sheriff: the patrol report was provided by Deputy Louis for hours of service from August 20, 2012 through September 17, 2012. There were 49 calls for service. August hours of service: 137.6

Maintenance: projects accomplished since the last meeting; replaced sidewalk on 6th Avenue, touched base with Van Meter about the 2 light poles with GFI problems, repaired 5th Street water main break, worked on the Ex-Mark, looked at a new dump truck, continue to work on the valve problem at the lift station, swept streets, and ordered chemicals for the wells. Projects to accomplish before the next meeting; drain bad fuel from the diesel pump, service leaf vac, take the Ex-Mark to Rexco, clean up yard waste site and perform monthly and quarterly water samples. A broken ¾" water line was found in 5th Street N. It could not be traced to the main and it cannot be determined how many houses are hooked to the line. At some point a decision will need to be made about discontinuing the line and hooking the houses up to the 5th Street main. This will probably be a job to be bid out.

Mayor Heeren attended a mayor's meeting and an Emergency Mgmt. meeting, neither of which had a quorum so no decisions were made at either of the meetings.

The P&Z minutes from September 18, 2012, updated CIP Summary and the 2012 Outstanding Debt Obligation report were provided to the council.

Old Business:

Nuisance Abatement – 173 Broadway: Councilman Brady is on vacation next week and will try to find a Wells Fargo contact to find out what is holding up the Release of Judgment from Wells Fargo.

Burn Barrels: Discussion was held on a plan for removal of burn barrels due to the passage of the **Burn Ban Ordinance**. Burn barrel usage will be prohibited after November 2nd. The City will contract with Rudd Sanitation for removal of the barrels and ashes on November 7th as a public service to the citizens. If a resident needs help getting the barrel emptied and to the curb the firemen have volunteered their services. The Clerk will contact Marcia at Rudd for finalization of the plan by the next council meeting.

Mayor Heeren met with Bob Tobin of Shoemaker and Haaland and the 3rd Avenue stop sign issue will be addressed by Tobin at the October 15th meeting. Councilman Miller requested the 501 Broadway camper issue also be put back on the next agenda.

New Business:

CIP Review: Council reviewed a 1st draft of the proposed Capital Projects and Equipment Purchases Plan.

Snowplow/Sander Purchase: Todd presented the specs for a 2001 Sterling M7500 truck equipped for use as a snowplow/sander from Don's Truck Sales. The truck with 24,330 miles on it was taken in on trade from the City of Manchester and totally refurbished. The truck comes with a 12 month 100% warranty on parts that were replaced and listed on the repair order list that came with the truck. There is also a Cat/Allison 30 day 50/50 warranty on engine and transmission major components. Motion was made by Brady, second by Miller to purchase the 2001 Sterling M7500 truck for the purchase price of \$47,500. All ayes, motion carried.
