

SPRINGVILLE CITY COUNCIL

Regular Meeting Minutes

July 10, 2017

The pledge of allegiance was recited to begin the meeting.

Mayor Shebetka called the special meeting of the Springville City Council to order at 6:00 pm in Springville City Hall. Present on roll call: Thies, Merritt, Hoyt, Sindelar, and Ralston. Also in attendance were: Jennifer and Todd Wyman, Mark Bloom, Lyle Andersen, Jean Menster, Dave Raue, and Susan Cooper.

Motioned by Sindelar, seconded by Thies, to approve the consent agenda. All ayes, motion carried.

Lyle Andersen and Susan Cooper described upset children, pets and vets due to excessive use of fireworks across several days and nights. Debris and disruption of the peace were also commented on. Council members and the Mayor also described dozens of phone calls and citizen complaints. A discussion on Fireworks will be on the next meeting's Agenda.

The Council directed the City Clerk to write a letter to citizens denying the request to use property taxes to fund sidewalk construction for 6th Street project.

Motioned by Merritt, second by Sindelar to close the City Waste Site from 7AM on August 6th until 8AM on August 14th. All ayes, motion carried.

Mayor Shebetka updated the council on the acquisition of emergency sirens for the City, including pursuing a 50/50 grant from Federal Government agencies. A discussion on options was held. A letter from SCTA was discussed whereby current systems may be repairable. Public Works was directed to investigate the potential repair of the current system as long as costs were low.

A discussion was held on Spring Meadows if the City, contractor, or Home Owner's Association should have ownership and responsibility for the repair and maintenance of the holding pond. The Council directed the City Clerk to investigate if DNR has liability for overflow from ditches. The council desired more time and information and will place the item on the Aug 17th meeting agenda.

Public Works has found issues with the construction of the School sidewalks and is pursuing resolution. Public Works will be driving the project to put a path around Cox Lake.

City Clerk reported on plans by Planning and Zoning to examine and potentially approve the 4th Addition to Spring Meadows.

Councilperson Ralston asked that the next Council Agenda pointed out that only the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to contact the City Attorney on City business and asked that a discussion costs for citizens to contact the City Attorney be held at the next regular meeting.

Mayor Shebetka asked that during the Grassley Town Hall meeting that citizens be civil and respectful. The Mayor also asked that City citizens get back to being good neighbors.

Motioned by Merritt, second by Ralston, to adjourn the meeting. All ayes motion carried.

Next regular meeting well be held at July 17th.

Mayor Shebetka adjourned the meeting at 7:05 PM.
