

# SPRINGVILLE CITY COUNCIL

## Meeting Minutes, April 30, 2018

Mayor Shebetka called the special meeting of the Springville City Council to order at 6:00 pm at City Hall. Present on roll call: Councilpersons: Brad Merritt, Jeff Grimley, Lyle Andersen, and Mareta Ralston. Dennis Thies was absent. Also in attendance: Terry Evans, Rick Evans, Janet Evans, Jean Menster, Anthony Mason, Corbin McCombs, Kevin Hulett, Jenifer Wyman, P.J. Hoyt, Chris Williams, Sarah Holub, Nick Holub, Patrick Hoyt Sr. Shane Malanaphy, Nate Hinders, Phillip Ellison, Mandy Ellison, Sarah Redling, Treva Davis, Assistant Clerk Michele Weinschenk, and City Attorney Mark Parmenter.

M/B Andersen to approve the consent agenda, 2/B Merritt, all ayes, M/C.

A general discussion by citizens and council was held on a letter received by the Fire Department from a law firm representing the Springville Tractor Pullers Association (STPA), the safety of the fireworks display and the fire response during the 2017 Fun Days, and the fire safety and emergency response at future Fun Days. Attorney Parmenter stated that public safety was the prime responsibility of the City and Fire Department. He further suggested that a small group be gathered to work toward a solution. Councilperson Andersen invited a representative each from STPA, Fire Department, and the City to meet and work through the issues discussed. Attorney Parmenter suggested that STPA make a list of their needs and desires for Fun Days, then the Fire Department provide their expertise on Public Safety to fulfill those needs in order to make a plan for public safety at the next Fun Days event. Councilperson Andersen will take responsibility to set a time and place for such a meeting.

A discussion about the Fire Agreement with Brown Township was held. Trustee Hulett confirmed that Brown Township Trustees had approved the agreement as drafted. Trustee Hulett also confirmed that there were 26 people currently serving with the Fire Department. He further suggested that that number might be reduced to 19 to 20 based on voluntary activity levels. Councilperson Ralston asked about personnel coverage of the emergency sirens. Trustee Hulett expressed his belief that an appropriate number of personnel are available. M/B Andersen to accept the Fire Agreement with Brown Township and authorize Mayor Shebetka to sign the document, 2/B Grimley, all ayes, M/C.

Resolution 26-2018 to transfer money between funds and Resolution 27-2018 to transfer money for debt payments were tabled until Clerk Bloom could be present.

Councilperson Andersen opened the discussion considering fireworks by suggesting that veterans and pets are unfairly harmed by fireworks. Councilperson Ralston stated that fireworks were a long-standing tradition in celebration of Independence Day. Councilperson Merritt suggested a compromise would be to limit consumer fireworks usage to Independence Day only. Mayor Shebetka said that some restrictions should be put in place to control the sale and manufacture of fireworks to ensure safety. General discussion led to an understanding that allowing fireworks to be set off only on Independence Day from 4PM to 11PM would be allowed.

Discussion was tabled on the FY18 Budget Amendment and FY18 Audit/Exam until Clerk Bloom could be present.

Discussion held on the DA Davidson bill for Bond Agent services. Council had unanswered questions and tabled the issue until Clerk Bloom could be present to provide answers.

Mayor Shebetka directed that a Special Council Meeting be held on May 14<sup>th</sup> to help Council catch up with items needing attention.

Public Works Director Wyman updated council on the progress and day-to-day issues on the Sewer Rehab Project and the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Reconstruction Project including an unexpected loss of water pressure for one afternoon. He also asked for citizen patience during these projects and said that the City will continue to provide the best possible information to citizens as the City becomes aware.

Councilperson Grimley described a serious accident at Broadway and 1<sup>st</sup> where no law enforcement showed up for over an hour. Council members thought to question the Sheriff's deputy at the next meeting.

Councilperson Ralston complimented the new format of the Springville Newsletter.

M/B Andersen to adjourn meeting, 2/B Merritt, all ayes, M/C.  
Next Council meeting will be held on Monday, May 7th, 2018.  
Mayor Shebetka adjourned the meeting at 7:40 PM.
