

SPRINGVILLE CITY COUNCIL

Meeting Minutes, June 4, 2018

Mayor Shebetka called the regular meeting of the Springville City Council to order at 6:00 pm at City Hall. Present on roll call: Councilpersons: Dennis Thies, Brad Merritt, Jeff Grimley, Lyle Andersen, and Mareta Ralston. Also in attendance were: Ryan Hosch, Madi Shafer, Joe Elsinger, and Steve Kalmes.

M/B Andersen to approve the consent agenda, 2/B Grimley, all ayes, M/C.

M/B Merritt to donate \$50 as a sponsorship of an award at Izzy's Classy Car Show, 2/B Ralston, all ayes, M/C. A discussion on the use of fireworks was held which include PTSD, pets, right to celebrate, tradition, limits of personal rights, state law, permits, consistency, and the limiting to ground based fireworks only.

M/B Andersen to pass Resolution 32-2018 A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE SEWER REPAYMENT AGREEMENT that facilitates repairs to a residents sewer line so that the 5th Street Project will not be delayed, 2/B Ralston; Ayes: Thies, Merritt, Grimley, Andersen, Ralston; Nays: none, M/C.

M/B Thies to pass Resolution 33-2018 A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND TO AUTHORIZE A WASTE MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT that would authorize the Mayor to sign and the Clerk to fulfil the agreement, 2/B Merritt; Ayes: Thies, Merritt, Grimley, Andersen, Ralston; Nays: none, M/C.

M/B Merritt to pass Resolution 34-2018 A RESOLUTION TO RESCIND RESOLUTION 29-2018 a budget amendment, 2/B Andersen; Ayes: Thies, Merritt, Grimley, Andersen, Ralston; Nays: none, M/C.

M/B Andersen to pass Resolution 35-2018 A BUDGET AMENDMENT as per the hearing held on May 21st, 2018, 2/B Ralston; Ayes: Thies, Merritt, Grimley, Andersen, Ralston; Nays: none, M/C.

M/B Ralston to pass Resolution 36-2018 A RESOLUTION SETTING THE WAGES AND SALARIES FOR APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF SPRINGVILLE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019 that will become effective July 1st, 2018, 2/B Andersen; Ayes: Thies, Merritt, Grimley, Andersen, Ralston; Nays: none, M/C.

M/B Andersen to approve residents request for a temporary POD to be stored on property at 507th 7th Ave for a period of not more than 60 days, 2/B Thies, all ayes, M/C.

M/B Ralston to approve a \$250 sponsorship of the Springville Extreme Quarry Run fund raiser, 2/B Merritt; all ayes, M/C.

The Clerk's reported that the new waste vendor would pickup commercial as well as residential waste as long as the business lets City Hall know and no more than two cans and recycling is put out each week (as with residential). Archery is legal inside city limits as long as it is on private property, written permission from council is required for archery on public property, except the school which may approve archery on school ground. A vendor has been found who can catch/neuter/release feral cats. The clerk was directed to create a first draft of possible pet ordinances for the council to consider at future meetings to include, pet licensing as funding, catch/neuter/release.

Public Works reported that the work on the 5th Street and Sewer Rehabilitation projects was proceed well.

Weather and some discovered, underground issues have delayed a couple of days, but the projects remain well within schedule and budget. Residents are being notified as soon as possible of future disturbances to traffic, water, and sewer flows.
