City Springville Public Works Department and COVID-19 or Coronavirus and you

The Springville Public Works is committed to our community's health and well-being. We will be able to continue to provide you and your family with safe water for use in drinking, cooking, bathing and laundry. The City of Springville has two deep drilled wells that we get our water from and a 250,000-gallon elevated storage tank. One of the wells is backed up by a diesel-powered generator in the event we would experience a power outage.

Our sanitary sewer system is gravity fed to one lift station. The lift station then moves the liquid to a lagoon system out of town. This lift station is also backed up by a diesel-powered generator to ensure an uninterrupted and working sanitary sewer system.

What can you do to help? Do not panic!!! Easier said than done, but use normal common sense. Do not flush anything down your toilet that you would not normally (rags or towels of any kind). Wash your hands often with soap and hot water, cover your cough and keep your hands away from your face, and practice social distancing.

Our department will continue to care for the streets and buildings and the parks will be cleaned and mowed as normal. All other things will be done as normal as time allows.

The City Maintenance Department will be doing the following things to avoid the spread of this virus.

1. Limiting face to face meetings
2. Closing our facilities to outside customers/vendors
3. Utilizing the use of phone, text, fax and e-mail
